THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF THE SOLOMON ISLANDS

In 2017 and 2018, the production of mineral commodities—notably bauxite—represented only a minor part of the economy of the Solomon Islands (table 1; Central Bank of Solomon Islands, 2018, p. 11, 58). The legislative framework for the mineral sector in the Solomon Islands is provided by the Mines and Minerals (Amendment) Act 2014. Data on mineral production are in table 1. Table 2 is a list of major mineral industry facilities. More-extensive coverage of the mineral industry of the Solomon Islands can be found in the previous editions of the U.S. Geological Survey Minerals Yearbook,
