Regarding U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) receipt of the April 8, 2014 email from Mr. Leonard S. Kurfirst of Surdyk & Baker on behalf of the Pavement Coatings Technology Council, subject: "Appeal to the USGS Response to two Requests for Correction of Information Submitted under U.S. Geological Survey Information Quality Guidelines." In a June 26, 2014 email, Mr. Kurfirst identified you the new point of contact for any future communications from the USGS related to these the two requests for correction of information related to three USGS publications (Web Site, Press Release, and Fact Sheet) on the topic of Coal Tar Sealants.
