Cascade Suffers Flood (1901, page 60)

Evidently a flood had caused damage in the town of Cascade, as an item from there in a July issue of the Star says: "Cascade, as Cascade the Beautiful, is no more, most of its beauty having been washed down the creek. You will find the sidewalk on the hillsides instead of in their accustomed places. Some say it is more picturesque since the flood but I fail to see it in that light. Mrs. McNab, who was occupying the Grand View Hotel at the time of the flood, was driven from the house at three in the morning. The building was a wreck, and is being torn down and hauled away.

Work was re-commenced on the Episcopal Church. It had been begun a few years earlier, but never finished.
