#### **SILVER IN APRIL 2023**




Figure 1. Monthly domestic production of silver in the United States from April 2021 through April 2023.

U.S. mines produced 97,000 kilograms (kg) of silver in April 2023 (table 1). Based on unrounded data, the average daily silver production in April was 3,230 kg, a 7% increase from the average daily silver production in March 2023, and a 14% increase from the average daily silver production of 2,830 kg for the full year 2022 (fig. 1, table 1).

#### **Prices**




Figure 2. Engelhard monthly silver prices for April 2021 through April 2023. Source: S&P Global Platts Metals Week.

In April 2023, the Engelhard average daily silver price was \$25.12 per troy ounce, a 14% increase from the March 2023 average daily price of \$22.08 per troy ounce, a slight increase from that in April 2022, and a slight decrease from that in April 2021. The daily price in April ranged between a high of \$25.90 per troy ounce and low of \$24.00 per troy ounce (fig. 2, table 2).

#### **Trade**

In April 2023, imports of silver in the form of bullion, dore, and ores and concentrates totaled 383,000 kg, a slight decrease from that in March 2023. This decrease from the previous month was owing to decreased imports of silver dore which decreased by 26%. Imports of silver dore decreased from Mexico (23,000 kg), Germany (1,110 kg), Colombia (594 kg), Nicaragua (542 kg), and Peru (515 kg), but were partially offset

by increased imports of silver dore from Chile (4,910 kg), Argentina (518 kg) and Canada (501 kg). Imports of bullion increased from Poland (22,700 kg), Belgium (15,400 kg), Turkey (15,200 kg), Switzerland (10,500 kg), and the Republic of Korea (9,790 kg) but decreased from Canada (41,500 kg), Mexico (18,900 kg), and Chile (5,440 kg). The leading import sources of silver in April 2023 in the form of bullion, dore, and ores and concentrates were: Mexico (193,000 kg), Canada (56,800 kg), Turkey (30,500 kg), Poland (22,700 kg), and the Republic of Korea (20,400 kg) (table 3).

#### New

On April 13, Hecla Mining Co. reported first quarter 2023 production. Greens Creek Mine produced 87,100 kg (2.80 million ounces) of silver, a 14% increase from the fourth quarter 2022. This was attributed to a combination of higher throughput, a 3% increase in grade and a 9% increase in recovery. Their Lucky Friday Mine produced 40,400 kg (1.30 million ounces) of silver, a 3% increase from the fourth quarter 2022. This was due to a 5% increase in mill throughput. The Keno Hill Mine development project was still planned on a third quarter mill start. The 2023 silver production at this mine was forecasted to exceed 77,800 kg (2.50 million ounces) (Hecla Mining Co, 2023).

According to The Silver Institute (2023) all major silver demand categories achieved record highs in 2022 which pushed total silver demand to a new high of 38.6 million kg (1.24 billion ounces). Silver industrial demand rose by 5%, physical investment increased by 22% and jewelry and silverware rose by 29% and 80% respectively. Since 2020, the global total has increased by 38% as world economies recover from the COVID-19 pandemic. Silver production was lower in 2022 which caused the silver market to have a 7.39 million kg (237.7 million ounce) deficit.
