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MAGNESIUM METAL IN THE SECOND QUARTER 2025

Total magnesium imports for consumption in the second quarter of 2025 were 21,100 metric tons (t), 3% more than those in the first quarter of 2025, 10% more than those in the second quarter of 2024, and 23% less than those in the second quarter of 2023 (table 1).

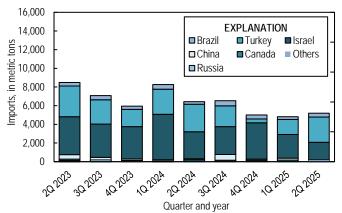


Figure 1. Quarterly imports of magnesium metal from the second quarter of 2023 through the second quarter of 2025. Source: U.S. Census Bureau, adjusted by USGS.

In the second quarter of 2025, imports of magnesium metal and alloys increased by 10% and 17%, respectively, but imports of scrap and semifabricated products decreased by 7% and 19%, respectively. Magnesium metal accounted for 25% of the total imports, with Turkey (51%), Israel (35%), and Brazil (8%) as the leading sources. Scrap accounted for 42% of the magnesium imports, with Canada (23%), Czechia (21%), and China (19%) as the leading sources. Alloys accounted for 29% of total imports, with the Republic of Korea (57%), Czechia (10%), and Israel (7%) as the leading sources (fig. 1, table 1).

Magnesium metal exports in the second quarter of 2025 were 7 t, compared with 13 t in the first quarter of 2025, 6 t in the second quarter of 2024, and 6 t in the second quarter of 2023

(table 1). Alloys accounted for 44% of total magnesium exports, with Canada and Singapore receiving 87% and 13% of exports, respectively. Semifabricated products accounted for 40% of total magnesium exports, with the United Kingdom (40%), Japan (12%), and the Republic of Korea (10%) as the leading destinations. Magnesium scrap accounted for 14% of total magnesium exports in the second quarter of 2025. The leading destinations of scrap were the Netherlands (49%), Canada (27%), and Brazil (22%). Magnesium metal accounted for the remainder of total magnesium exports in the second quarter of 2025.

The average U.S. spot dealer import price for magnesium was unchanged in the second quarter of 2025. At the beginning of the second quarter, the U.S. spot dealer import price range was \$3.00 to \$3.25 per pound and remained in that range by the end of the second quarter. In Europe, the average price was 8% higher at the end of the quarter compared with that at the beginning of the quarter. At the beginning of the quarter, the European free market price range was \$2,300 to \$2,410 per metric ton. By the end of the second quarter, the price range was \$2,500 to \$2,600 per metric ton (table 2).
